LIBRARY MEDIA SERVICES

LIBRARY INFORMATION

IDs are required when visiting the library.

Passes are not needed before school and/or during lunch.

Book Checkout Time

2 weeks

Due dates are stamped on the card in the back of the book.

Books can be renewed if needed past the due date. You must return the book to the library and check it out again.

Fines: 5 cents per day per book

Printing Cost

Black and white: 10 cents per page

Color: 50 cents per page

INDIVIDUAL/ GROUP VISITS

During class periods 1, 2, 3 & 4, teachers may send students to the library with their student agenda. Each student must have his/her own student agenda. The library adheres to the school's policies which are:

1. Student agenda must be signed and dated by your regular classroom teacher.
2. Handwritten passes and student agendas signed by substitute teachers are not accepted.
3. Students are in compliance with the uniform policy.
4. Student's ID must be visible in the neck area, readable and on a clip/lanyard.

LIBRARY VISIT PROCEDURE

For all student visits, you are required to sign in upon arrival in the library's sign in book which is located on the circulation desk as you enter the library.

Food and drink must be consumed before entering the library.

COMPUTER USE

Computers are for educational use, therefore, there is no access to games, chat, or email.

If a student needs to save information from the Internet or online resources, they should bring a jump drive. For online resources, a student can email articles, or save them in an online personal folder.
